Welcome & Opening Prayer

Mrs. Williamson opened the meeting with a prayer.

Board

We are still in need of a Secretary to take notes and type Meeting Minutes.

Safety Committee

Mrs. Williamson stated that there are no updates with the GEMA Assessment. Mr. Chromy asked Mrs. Williamson to follow up with local HVAC vendors to determine if they are Emergency Assistance to Non-Public Schools approved vendors and to secure an estimate for airborne safety improvements. The estimates need to be completed before March 25th. Mrs. Williamson provided 50 Lockdown Magnetic Strips for use on the classroom doors. The strips provide a way for teachers and staff to secure doors in the event of an emergency in which staying inside the classroom is paramount. Mr. Chromy stated at this time, no new filters or UV lights have been purchased to maintain the use of the current classroom air purifiers. Mr. Chromy asked Mrs. Williamson to follow up on the costs to submit on the EANS II application.

Budget

The budget was not discussed or distributed. Mr. Chromy stated that he is working diligently on our EANS II Application. This funding could provide our school with much needed equipment as well as staffing funds. The EANS II application is due March 25, 2022. Approval should be returned at the end of April 2022. If approved, the submitted projects and purchases should be completed and acquired by September 2022, with the consideration of the vendor availability and accessibility to materials.

Playground Committee

Mr. Chromy shared that he attended the previously rescheduled grant proposal meeting with the Lewis Foundation. He will secure an updated estimate for the refurbishment of the Parish Activity Center's gym floor to submit. Mr. Chromy stated that the Jog-a-thon will be held on Field Day. This event is a fundraiser for our playground equipment. Students will solicit donations for laps or participation. Home and School Association is responsible for the success of the event. HSA plans to create an electronic format for donations.

Old Business

Mr. Chromy stated that the detailed Parent Surveys should be available in the next few weeks. The survey will include, but is not limited to, questions about interest in extracurriculars and hot lunches returning. Mr. Chromy stated that he is still waiting on the new estimate for the refurbishment of the PAC's gym floor.

New Business/Parent Questions

Mr. Chromy indicated that students will be allowed to celebrate St. Patrick's Day. Students will be allowed to wear green tops on Thursday, March 17. Mr. Chromy shared that families will be participating in a Spring Raffle. Families will be required to sell 20 tickets at \$5 each for Chick-fil-a Sandwiches. The proceeds will go towards the renovation of the PAC gym floor. Mr. Chromy stated the Dennis Uniforms will still be our uniform provider for the 2022-2023 Academic Year. Mr. Chromy shared that he is working on the implementation of new opportunities for extracurriculars and electives for the next academic year. Some of these potential classes include Performing Arts such as dance and theatrics. Other classes may include faith-based electives. Mr. Chromy addressed the concern about the circumstances in the Ukraine and how our students internalize the current events. He plans to encourage staff to include the Ukraine in their prayer and rosary time with students.

Marketing and Relations

There were no updates in Marketing and Relations. Mr. Chromy asked Mrs. Williamson to follow up with Ms. Sara Brown about specific concerns.

Principal's Report

Mr. Chromy shared that he's specifically looking into funding opportunities for a School Counselor and Interventionalist compensation for the 2022-2023 Academic Year.
